Course Description

This is an advanced-level elective course that focuses on helping students improve their grammar knowledge to become successful academic writers. This class addresses students' individual needs to understand grammatical structures fundamental to college writing and to develop effective proofreading skills.

Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs)

When you complete this course, you will be able to:

- Analyze and use English grammar, usage and mechanics for correctness in writing for various academic purposes.
- Evaluate own writing to edit and proofread effectively.
- Develop awareness of error patterns and make corrections and improvements to those patterns.

Attendance

You are expected to attend every class and arrive by 1:30pm. If you are going to be absent during the first 2 weeks of the quarter, you must notify the instructor. If not, the instructor may drop you. If you miss more than two classes, you will lose 10% of your

grade (all your participation points). Three tardies equal one absence. For attendance to count, you must join our Zoom meeting through Canvas, be on time, and participate in class actively. Turning on your camera during class is a great way to ensure your success and participation.

Quizzes:

You will have several grammar editing quizzes.

Homework:

You will receive various homework assignments that will be done in the book and checked regularly. Doing homework is the best way to ensure your understanding of the materials covered in class.

No late homework accepted. The instructor will ask you to read answers to questions on Zoom.

Midterm and Final:

Two exams will be given to check your understanding of the class materials and to check your progress.
